Tammy Killed

A tragedy of unparalleled magnitude hit the family of our prime minster last Prime Minister Chris Dorn and his wife Tammy were found dead in their home last night, together with their nephew Ian Miller and Dorn's aide Josh Ward. Interview with Tanja Kennedy

SHANNON: Tanja Kennedy, a seasoned Shakespearean actress, took recently on the role of the Nurse in a production of Romeo and Juliet. Tanja, can you tell us about your experience playing Shakespeare?

TANJA: In the past I have played many lead characters in Shakespeare's plays. Looking back, I think I have actually played all leading female characters. Shakespeare was always my passion, I always enjoyed his work, and early on in my career specialised on his plays.

SHANNON: How did this passion for Shakespeare start?

Tanja: It started when I was still a teenager, and I got really fascinated by Shakespeare's use of the English language. Just listen to "There's gold for thee. Thou must not take my former sharpness ill. I will employ thee back

again; I thee most fit for business." This just rolls off your tongue.

SHANNON: So what is your favourite scene this time?

TANJA: In order to answer this question, let me just say: "So please you, let me now be left alone, and let the nurse this night sit up with you, for I am sure you have your hands full in this so sudden business." This is the most beautiful scene I have ever played.

SHANNON: I can't help noticing that the nurse does not even speak in your f a v o u r i t e scene.

Tanja: I have to admit that the casting decision did surprise me a bit. After all, I have received glorious reviews for my Juliet on Broadway, but instead a rather young newcomer is trusted to play this important role. But it is not my decision to make, and I have to trust the director Nicci Davis.

SHANNON: What was your favourite role?

Tanja: Ah, I played so many, and received so much critical acclaim, and I liked so many of them. But if really had to pick one favourite, it would be the role allowing me to say

"But man, proud man, drest in a little brief authority, most ignorant of what he's most assur'd; his glassy essence, like an angry ape, such fantastic tricks before high heaven, as make the angels weep."

Shannon: Many of Shakespeare's plays create their most memorable impact by the relationship of a couple on the stage. Can you tell us your experience of playing with male lead actors?

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TANJA: This is certainly true. So much passion is awoken by the relationship between two characters. Not only Romeo and Juliet. Once of the most memorable, very British interaction was "By earth, she is not, corporal. There you lie. Her amber hairs for foul hath amber. An amber-coloured raven was well noted." I really loved playing this, and it was one of my greatest successes.

SHANNON: How do you prepare for a role?

TANJA: I study a lot and work very hard. You will find me listening to audio recordings of the plays, and doing a lot of reading of course. Once I start to memorise my lines, you will find me mumbling to myself while exercising, walking, even shopping. I am sure I have confused more than one shopkeeper by suddenly saying "A fellow of the royal bed (which owe a moiety of the throne), a great king's daughter, the mother to a hopeful prince, standing to prate and talk for life and honour 'fore who please to come and hear" instead of asking for a litre of milk or so. I will really start to live the roles.

SHANNON: Can you tell us about your experience portraying the iconic character of the Nurse?

Tanja: Portraying the Nurse is an incredibly rewarding experience. It's a character that brings a unique blend of humour, warmth, and maternal concern to the stage. I've always been fascinated by the complexity of Shakespeare's characters, and the Nurse, even though

only a minor role, is no exception.

SHANNON: How did you approach bringing your own interpretation to such a well-known character?

TANJA: Well, the challenge

with this role is to find a

perspective fresh while staying true to t h e essence of the character. With t h e Nurse, I aimed to emphasise her nurturing and caring nature, almost as a mother figure to Juliet. It reminded me very much of another role: "That never words were music to thine ear, that never object pleasing thine eye, that

TANJA: No, I am really easy going, and I don't expect any special treatment,

even when playing a lead character. Ah well, I appreciate of course if someone thinks of the stress a lead actress is under, and maybe provides some fresh strawberries. Nice red ones, that

t h e carpet that should have been rolled out for me. Really nice was also the

life-sized cut out of me in one venue, something I should maybe mention to the stage manager, my dressing room looks quite empty. So you see, I really don't have any special demands.

SHANNON: Do you have recommendations for any actress that is interested in taking up a career playing Shakespeare roles?

TANJA: It is all about the language. You need to start small. Savour each word, each sentence, and each paragraph. Even

though the language might be somewhat archaic, you must make the words your own. Repeat the paragraphs over and over, till you sound naturally. You can't imagine how much time I spent repeating: "And truly I'll devise some honest slanders to stain my cousin with. One doth not know how much an ill may empoison liking."

Shannon: What are your future plans? Do you already have the next Shakespeare production lined up?

TANJA: This current production is quite stressful, so I actually intend to have a bit of a break. As a lead actress you have to make sure not to burn out, or as Shakespeare put it: "But lend and give where she is sure to lose; that seeks not to find that her implies, but riddle-like lives sweetly where she dies."

SHANNON: When will be the premiere of this new Romeo & Juliet production?

TANJA: The premiere will be next week at the Cryptex Players Theatre.

Shannon: Thank you, Tanja, for sharing your insights. It's been a pleasure speaking with you.

TANJA: The pleasure is mine. Thank you for having me.


